A call to action for our coast



WHAT IS COAST DAY?

Coast Day is the annual celebration of the **natural**, **economic** and cultural heritage of the Mediterranean coastal zone. This regional initiative highlights the vital importance of coastal areas to people and planet alike, and promotes solutions for their long-term sustainability in the face of today's growing environmental and social pressures.

Coast Day is celebrated every year on 25 September, to mark the first ratification of the ICZM Protocol by Slovenia, in 2009. The ICZM Protocol is a groundbreaking agreement through which all 21 Mediterranean countries have committed to use smart planning to better manage and protect their coastal areas. Uniting biodiversity, culture and socioeconomics, its central purpose is to make sure our coasts are resilient and thriving — today, and for generations to come.

With a different national host each year, the Coast Day programme is coordinated by PAP/RAC, the Croatia-based regional centre for coastal management of the Mediterranean Action Plan (MAP) of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), with a range of partners across the region. From Ministries of the Environment down to local community organizations — from government to grassroots — anyone can get involved. The goal is to throw the spotlight on coastal sustainability — on 25 September, but also throughout the year.



WHY COAST DAY MATTERS MORE THAN EVER



The Mediterranean coast is facing unprecedented challenges that directly impact the **150 million people** living along its shores, threatening their livelihoods, lifestyles, and wellbeing.

Rapid urbanization and mass tourism are degrading fragile coastal ecosystems, while pollution, unsustainable resource exploitation and habitat loss threaten marine biodiversity. Climate change impacts — happening 20% faster here than the global average — amplify all these threats.

This is radically changing real lives, and things are getting worse. Indeed, the "Med 2050" report from UNEP/MAP's Plan Bleu warns that in another 25 years the Mediterranean will be 'in a far more alarming situation than it is today.'

What will the Mediterranean look like in 2050?


Temperatures will be 2.3°C above the pre-industrial average



Sea levels will be 40 cm higher



Marine ecosystems will be 'tropicalized', and periodically hit by deadly 'marine heatwaves'



Populations of exploited marine species will fall by 20%



Crop yields will be 17% lower



Almost the entire population of the basin will suffer from water shortages



The regional population will grow by 20-30%, reaching up to 690 million inhabitants



At least half of the region's population and activities will be concentrated on the coastline — a steep increase from 30-40% today



FROM AWARENESS TO IMPACT

Large-scale, coordinated adaptation to the realities of this future we face is essential and urgent. Coast Day is a unique way to get the message out there, to accelerate momentum, and to galvanize real action.

Coast Day cuts across social and cultural divides to unite institutions, scientists, educators, businesses and communities across the Mediterranean. Publicized through a range of channels to reach a wide audience, its visibility is also amplified by Coast Ambassadors, public figures who champion the cause and get supporters on board.

By raising awareness and bringing people together, Coast Day creates spaces where diverse voices discuss common challenges, spark innovative ideas, and scale up real-world solutions across the Mediterranean.
